- & Always carry enough life jackets. Wear them aboard ≤16 foot craft.
- Always check the weather before you sail. Never sail in conditions you aren't comfortable in. Members are responsible for equipment damaged by sailing in sustained winds greater than 20 mph.

Be Active


- Participate in sailing, maintenance, social activities, and general meetings

- Let an officer know if you break something it's not a big deal, we just need to know when things break so we can fix them promptly.




Parts of a Sailboat






Parts of a Sail






Getting Oriented on a Sailboat






Points of Sail


Ports of Sail

Lake Bryan

- Get to Harvey Mitchell Pkwy/FM Rd 2818 and head NorthWest out of College Station
- Turn left on to Sandy Point Rd (intersection has a traffic light)
- Drive 3.4 miles on Sandy Point Rd and turn right at the sign for Lake Bryan

There is a \$5 day use fee at Lake Bryan. AYC members can buy a \$35 annual pass.





Lake Conroe

- Head Southeast out of College Station on Highway 6
- Exit toward Texas-105 E
- Turn left onto Texas-105 E
- Continue until you pass through Montgomery and take a left on Walden Rd (at the Wal-Mart)
- Turn left onto River Rd
- Turn right at the sign for the Conroe Yacht Club at the entrance to a dirt road

Lake Somerville

- Take University Dr/FM 60 SouthWest out of College Station
- Stay on FM 60 until it ends at Texas Highway TX-36
- Turn left on TX-36 towards the town of Somerville
- Drive approximately 2.6 miles and turn right onto Thornberry Dr (there will be a sign for Somerville Lake, near the Las Fuentes Mexican restaurant)
- Our boatyard is off of Thornberry Dr, or to continue on to the lake, stya on Thornberry Dr across the dam and look for signs to the Lake Somerville Marina
